FENTANYL HAS BEEN FOUND IN BLACK TAR

Recent overdose deaths involved **fentanyl** in black tar. This is new in King County.



Fentanyl continues to be most common in **pills**, primarily M30s. It can also be found in **white powers**.



Reduce overdose risk

- **Avoid using alone.** If you must use alone, have someone check on you often or use a service like *neverusealone.com*.
- **Have naloxone (Narcan) ready** to reverse an overdose. Find it near you at *stopoverdose.org*.
- **Recognize signs of overdose:** abnormal breathing (slow or no breath, gurgling, snoring), not responding, grey or blue skin.
- **Call 911** right away if you suspect an overdose.
