

Educationally Disadvantaged: From an environment that has inhibited you from obtaining knowledge, skills and abilities required to enroll in and graduate from a health professions school. Here are some examples:

- 1) Graduated from (or attended) a high school from which: (a) a low percentage of seniors receive a high school diploma, or (b) a low percentage of graduates go to college during the first year after graduation, or (c) students have low average SAT scores
- 2) Graduated from (or attended) a high school with low per capita funding.
- 3) Graduated from (or attended) a high school at which, to the best of your knowledge, at least 50% of the enrolled students were eligible for free or reduced price lunches.
- 4) Come from a family that lived in an area designated as a health professional shortage area.
- 5) You are the first generation in your family to attend college.
- 6) You have a diagnosed physical or mental impairment that substantially limits your participation in educational experiences
